INTERNATIONAL DEPARTMENT

Our International Department strives to make sure your family is well supported while living in Denmark. We can offer assistance with accommodation and lifestyle issues, and we always try to make you feel welcome at our school. International parents are invited to a weekly 'Coffee-Club' to meet other parents and to discuss any issues they may have with our staff. Parents also have the opportunity to become members of our Parents and Teachers Association (PTA).

Education programme

In August, 2012, our International Department opened and we now offer Cambridge Primary for pupils, within the first age group, from 5 to 11 years old.

Next summer 2013 we will also be offering Secondary 1 curriculum and examinations for the age group, 11-14 years old.

Our future plans include 15-16 years old and the IGCSE examinations.



Students are currently taught English, Mathematics and Science from the Cambridge curriculum. The rest is a combined curriculum of P.E, Religious Education, Arts & Crafts and Social Studies. All lessons are taught in English, apart from Second Language lessons which are in Danish.

OUR SCHOOL IN THE CITY OF ROSKILDE

Skt. Josef's School is situated in the historic centre of Roskilde, close to the Cathedral (UNESCO world heritage site) and surrounded by beautiful parks.



Roskilde is a historic but vibrant city and every year hosts Scandinavians biggest music event – Roskilde Festival. Roskilde was recently voted the best commercial centre and the best town for youth in Denmark.

Roskilde has a high density of elementary, lower secondary, secondary schools, technical colleges and further education institutions, all within a five kilometre radius.

The city is also home to Roskilde University (RUC), Danish Technology University (DTU), University College Sjælland (UCSJ) and the new green tech Risø Business Park.
